Nationalism/Patriotism and Globalisation: Looking into their Interfaces



Professor Kosaku Yoshino

Professor of Sociology, Sophia University, Tokyo

Prof. Yoshino received his PhD in Sociology from the London School of Economics in 1986 and is currently Professor of Sociology at Sophia University, Tokyo. He has taught at the University of Tokyo and was promoted to full professor there in 2005. As a sociologist specializing in cultural nationalism and identity studies, he has published widely on nationalism, identity, and Englishization of education. His publications are mostly in English.

Abstract

We are now entering a new phase in world history in which nationalism and patriotism not only persist but also increase and intensify in spite of or in response to globalisation. The remarkable growth in studies of globalisation and nationalism since the early 1990s reflects these seemingly contradictory tendencies. Whether nationalism withers or flourishes in the wake of the creation of supranational alternatives as required by the logic of globalisation is an issue that is being debated in social sciences. Rather than concern ourselves with such an either-or question, the talk will attempt to make a sociological enquiry into arenas where nationalism and patriotism are being produced and reproduced in ways that have yet to be studied in depth. Illustrations will be drawn from the experiences of Japan and other Asian countries.
